When Maris finds out they were both orphaned and raised in state care, a friendship forms that sets them on a path to change both of their lives for the better.



In the world of competitive free diving, Jessea Lu (Lu Wenjie) is a legendary figure. The Chinese free diving champion came late to the sport, vaulting into the top tier of talent with remarkable ability and a compulsive drive to challenge her limitations. But in the ocean, you cannot hide from yourself.

In a deep dive, when consciousness shrinks to a singular point, any mistake can prove disastrous. During a world-record attempt in 2018, Jessea blacked out and was lifeless for four minutes.

Award-winning director Yuqi Kang's feature documentary 7 Beats Per Minute parallels Jessea's physical and mental journey back from the depths, with intimate cinéma vérité camera work, astonishing underwater imagery and raw personal interviews.

As the boundaries between the filmmaker and her subject grow more fluid, the two return to the site of Jessea's near-death experience to face the traumas of her past and find a way back to light, air and, ultimately, connection.

ARCHITECTON

From filmmaker Victor Kossakovsky (Guna, Aquarela) comes an epic, intimate and poetic meditation on architecture and how the design and construction of buildings from the ancient past reveal our destruction – and offer hope for survival and a way forward.

Centering on a landscape project by the Italian architect Michele De Lucchi, Kossakovsky uses the circle to reflect on the rise and fall of civilizations, capturing breathtaking imagery from the temple ruins of Baalbek in Lebanon, dating back to AD 60, to the recent destruction of cities in Turkey following a 7.8 magnitude earthquake in early 2023.

Rock and stone connect the disparate societies, from ghostly monoliths stuck in the earth to tragic heaps of concrete rubble waiting to be hauled off and repurposed anew. Through Kossakovsky's inquisitive lens, the grandeur and folly of humanity and its precarious relationship with nature posits the urgent questions: How do we build and how can we build better, before it's too late?


But just as things seem to be working out, external forces threaten Liv and Alex's budding relationship in macabre ways they cannot expect.



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

In a modest home near the Tirupathi temple, 28-year-old homemaker Saraswathi and her husband Prasad, a bus conductor, live with their sons Arun (11) and Varun (10). At 16, Saraswathi chose marriage over education out of love for Prasad. Her lack of formal schooling becomes a challenge when Arun struggles with math, particularly the concept of zero, leading to poor grades and humiliation from his teacher, Chanakya. The situation worsens with Arun's suspension and Prasad's decision to hold him back a year.

Their journey underscores the power of perseverance, family support, and community intervention in overcoming adversity.




